Foreword

SSE Renewables continues to be one of the leading developers and operators of onshore wind in Ireland, and 2023/24 was a memorable year in the delivery of new onshore wind. In December 2023, our 33MW Lenalea Wind Farm, a joint venture with FuturEnergy Ireland, entered operations and is now delivering clean, green electricity to the grid. Our 101MW Yellow River Wind Farm in County Offaly continues to make progress, with turbine installation beginning in January 2024, and construction on track to be completed this year.

We have been succesfully sharing the value of our renewable assets with local communities for over 20 years. We have marked this significant milestone by enhancing our funding strategy to focus on lasting impact for local communities. As we embed our enhanced approach, we are proud to be working with the Offaly and Donegal communities to ensure their new Lenelea and Yellow River community funds will achieve impact on local priorities and guarantee the decisions are made by local people.

As we look ahead, we're pleased to reflect on the progress that we've made in 2023/34, with the grant of planning permission from An Bord Pleanála for Sheskin Wind Farm in Co. Mayo, part of our joint venture with FuturEnergy Ireland. We're also continuing to making progress with our flagship Arklow Bank Wind Park 2 project, which was submitted to An Bord Pleanála for planning permission in June of this year. Should these projects be delivered, they will be critical to the delivery of Ireland's 2030 climate targets, as well as generating meaningful impact for neighbouring communities and local economies.


The support of 268 community projects in Ireland in 2023/24 exemplifies the positive relationship which is created between energy and communities.

Achieving our priorities

SSE Renewables has continued to enhance the delivery of our community funds in 2023/24. We have marked our 20th year of investing in communities and we have focused on several priorities to ensure the funds provide impact for Irish communities.

Lenalea - We have continued to develop the new community fund which will support the central Donegal communities. Over the past year we have recruited and trained a panel of local community members to make up the community benefit committee (p9). This committee will ensure all funding decisions are made by local people for the benefit of the local community.

Yellow River - We have successfully completed a community needs assessment and community consultation with the County Offaly community (p8).

This exercise is the foundation of ensuring that the community fund focuses on projects that achieve local priorities. A community committee has been formed and they will be responsible for appraising funding applications and subsequently awarding the funds.

2024/25 **Priorities**


In 2024/25 SSE Renewables will focus on the following priorities for the community funds:

Galway Major Projects Fund - we have launched the next round of the fund to support transformational projects which provide a legacy for the Galway communities.

New funds - The first rounds of both the Lenelea Community Fund and the Yellow River Community Fund will open for applications with all decisions being made by the local panels.

- Funding strategy following a consultation with grant holders, a new funding strategy has been developed for our existing community benefit funds. The strategy focuses on lasting and transformational projects. We have also introduced multi-year funding which will allow for larger projects which will have a longer term impact in the community (p5).
- Data management We have implemented a new grant management system (p10). We have worked closely with the developers, Bluewave, and software provider, Salesforce, to develop a robust and community focused grant management system which enables all data to be captured safely and securely.

- Arklow Bank Wind Farm 2 we will increase our engagement with the local County Wicklow community to ensure that initial actions are progressed to deliver a lasting legacy community fund for the offshore wind farm.
- **RESS** we will continue to liaise with the Irish Government to ensure that the future rounds of Renewable Electricity Support Scheme provide clarity and impact for local communities.

Nurturing children

€9,200 Awarded from Cavan and Monaghan Community Fund

Rainbow Kids Playgroup CLG

Across all community funds a priority which is repeatedly identified by residents is ensuring there are opportunities for young people. It is recognised that children are the future of the community and investing in their well-being will help the community for decades to come. Children's provision is also important for communities as it helps attract young families to live in the area.

The community of Kill near the Bindoo Wind Farm was struggling to support working parents as there was no wraparound care for school aged children. The local playgroup worked with parents and children to re-purpose a local property into an after-school haven. 40 children now benefit from a range of educational, social, and recreational activities to widen their interests and learning. A key component of the new site is the nature garden with wildflowers, nesting boxes and raised beds for organic vegetable planting. The garden is maintained by the children and helps instill a love and responsibility for nature from a young age.

Providing lasting legacy

Kantoher Development Association

SSE Renewables has introduced a new funding strategy in Ireland to ensure the funds create a legacy. One of the changes introduced is providing multi-year funding which provides greater certainty for anchor organisations and provides the investment required to provide long-term impact.

A five-year award to Kantoher Development Association has enabled them to transform a derelict building into a thriving community hub. The early commitment from the West Limerick and North Kerry Community Fund helped attract €700,000 match funding.

The hub provides a portfolio of social and recreational activities to benefit all ages of the community. The project has been important to revitalise a local eye-sore into a thriving community asset. The project has also considered its environmental impact and has energy efficiency measures to reduce carbon emissions. €100,000 Awarded from West Limerick & North Kerry Community Fund

Enhancing community parks

Corribdale Grounds Committee Ltd

Recreational spaces can be vital for local communities. They provide a healthy space for residents of all ages to gather and enjoy the local nature.

The well utilised site in Oughterard, Galway had not had significant investment for over 15 years. To ensure the facilities continue to meet the needs of future generations the volunteer committee established an ambitious enhancement plan to create an improved multi-generational site. The playpark has been enhanced with a new zipline which should last for 20 years, the walking paths have been resurfaced so that they can be accessed by all ability levels and a new tennis facility is being created to provide sports facilities for all ages and abilities. The new facilities will benefit 6,000 residents.

Supporting the elderly

Millstreet and District Housing Association

A key concern for many elderly residents of rural areas is how they continue to live in their local community as they grow older. The provision of affordable and adapted housing is vital to responding to the needs of an ageing population.

The Millerstreet Centre in County Cork has provided a safe home for elderly residents for over thirty years but needed renovations to ensure it remained safe and secure.

The Coomacheo and Curragh Community Fund has provided €28,238 over the last five years to improve the safety and energy efficiency of the homes. The new provision has helped eight homes to be reinvigorated and has reduced energy bills for pensioners.

Consulting with local communities Yellow River Community Fund



Yellow River Community Fund

Yellow River Wind Farm is a 29-turbine 101MW development, in Rhode, Co. Offaly. It is currently in construction and has the potential to power 66,000 homes with green, renewable energy. Based on industry best practice, and in line with Government policy, SSE Renewables has completed an extensive community consultation process, to identify the needs and opportunities within the local community. This will ensure that the new community benefit fund focuses on local needs and achieves local priorities, while embedding the UN Sustainable Development Goals into their projects in a meaningful way.

Across 2023 eight community events were held with the local community, including focused elderly and youth forums to seek the views of people of all ages. The inperson events were supplemented by online surveys to ensure the views of a wide range of residents were secured.

The findings of the needs assessment highlighted that the local area has a strong community spirit and benefits from a rich culture and heritage. It was recognised the area has some derelict buildings and a lack of diversity of facilities. There is concern in the area about retaining volunteers and the cost of living. This exercise provided clarity on where the community fund can add best value to the local area.

During the consultation, the residents identified their priorities for the new fund, and these will include developing inclusive community facilities and projects, increasing educational opportunities and improving health and wellbeing for residents.

An independent panel to make funding decisions has been identified and will be inducted in 2024 before the first round of the fund is launched in 2025.

Community led decision making

Lenalea Community Fund

Lenalea Wind Farm is a seven turbine 30.1 MW site in County Donegal. It is a joint venture between SSE Renewables and FuturEnergy Ireland. The wind farm is able to generate enough low carbon renewable energy to power 20,000 homes. Following a successful community consultation in 2022 and 2023 the community have been supported to establish a community committee comprising local representatives to make the funding decisions.

Establishing local decision making ensures the projects funded meet local priorities and needs. By local representatives being empowered to make the decisions it increases the funds transparency and creates a longer legacy for the area. In late 2023 an open recruitment event was held to inform the community of the roles and responsibilities of the local committee. It was confirmed that committee members would need to commit to up to seven meetings per year and would need to undertake an induction programme and complete anti bribery training.
