About Yellow River Wind Farm

Yellow River Wind Farm is a 29-turbine wind farm currently under construction in Rhode, Co. Offaly. The project received planning permission in 2014 and in October 2022 SSE Renewables commenced the construction process of the wind farm. When completed, the wind farm will produce enough clean green energy to power the equivalent of around 66,000 homes annually.

We have now installed our final turbine and are nearing the end of our construction phase. We have already begun our reinstatement and landscaping at the site and expect the project to be fully operational at the start of 2025.

Grid connection

The substation for Yellow River Wind Farm is located at Rhode Green Energy Park and construction is being undertaken by Suir Engineering. The substation buildings have now been completed, and the electrical installation and commissioning is underway. External civils work, which include fencing and landscaping, are nearing completion. Works are also progressing well on the grid cable ducting and cable installation, which will allow energy to be transported from the substation to the national grid.

Community Benefit Fund

The initial meetings will focus on the Community Consultation report which will in turn provide the basis of the Funding Strategy for the Yellow River Community Benefit Fund. The Strategy will open for public consultation before the end of 2024, and will underpin the Yellow River Community Benefit Fund.
